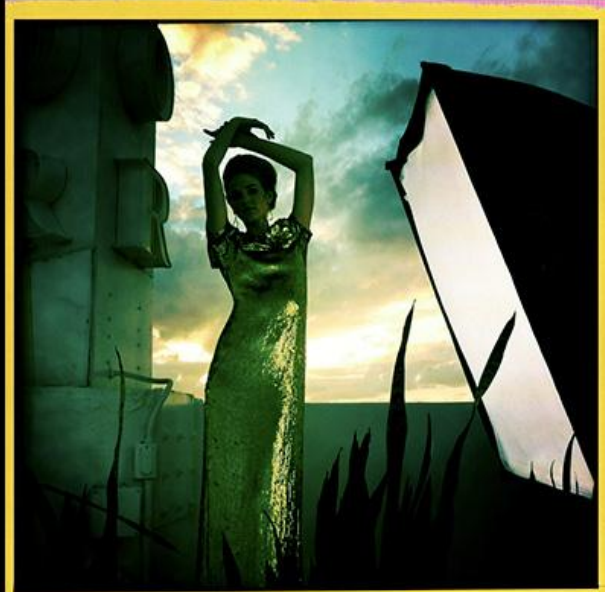
We are losing a lot in the process: No more respect for people, equipment and customers.

Wallin & Vallin Ljus, Dagsljus and Ljud & Bildmedia all provided equipment on the second screen version of the famous best-seller Trilogy by Stieg Larsson: Millenium. Jokers were used on locations.

Famous Swedish commercial **DOP Fredrik Bäckar FSF** started the film but was replaced by US cinematographer **Jeff Cronenweth ASC**. **David Fincher** and Jeff go back a long way. Jeff was already AC on *Se7en*, 2nd unit on *The Game* and did, as cinematographer, two of Fincher's most successful films: *Fight Club* and *The Social Network*.

Fredrik was replaced for artistic reasons. **Fincher** and him apparently did not share the same vision, but did share enough for **Frederick Bäckar** to have quite a few of his shots in the movie.

Note that this is a remake of the Swedish films shot in 2009 by Danish Cinematographer **Eric Kress**. **Kress** was the first Scandinavian Cinematographer to use the Alpha 18K from **Dagsljus** on *Arn: The KnightTemplar* in 2007.

"When I was asked to shoot the second season of "Shakespeare Unlocked" for the BBC and the Royal Shakespeare Company I knew I'd need a very particular kind of light to help me. I had seen the Joker Bugs at a demo by LCA lights in London and quickly realized that their compact size, powerful output and incredible range of accessories were the perfect combination. My creative remit was to deliver cinematic images while showcasing the existing lighting design at the Royal Shakespeare Theatre. With limited time and multiple lighting styles to work within I used Joker Bug 400 and 800's direct and with both Soft Tube and China ball accessories, mixing both hard and soft light in a variety of rigging situations. Their flexibility and ease of use kept us on schedule and the beautiful quality of light gave us results we are all extremely pleased with"

Focus on Camerimage:

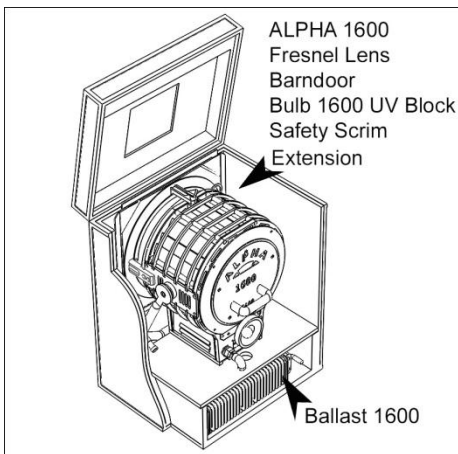


The second year in Bydgoszcz and 19th edition of **Camerimage** ended on the 3rd of December with clement weather. This year we shared a booth with the famous zoom manufacturers **Angenieux** and **Transvideo** the pioneer in clever camera monitors. Together, we sponsored two events on the theme of 3D: A screening of **Wim Wenders Pina**, followed by **The 3D Frame**, a masterclass with **Denis Rouden AFC** and **Alain Derobe**, Stereographer who discussed their recent collaboration on the latest episode of the Asterix saga, *On Her Majesty's Service*. **Benjamin B** moderated the 90 minutes session which centered on 3D framing and camera movement, in front of an captivated audience of 160 people.



John Seale ASC was honored at Camerimage, becoming the 19th Director of Photography to receive Lifetime achievement award. We have a bit of history with John and his long time gaffer **Mo Flam**. They were the first to use the softtubes on *City Of Angels* for a bus scene. So when they went to Italy for *The Tourist*, Sebastien our man in Italy, showed them the Alpha 4K thinking it would be a good tool for their location shots in Venice. They took two and did not regret it as John mentioned: “*I thought the new 4k was a great light ...we are always wanting more power from the lamps ,and this one adds that much more ...especially on the night shoots on Anamorphic lenses ,where every foot candle counts and the 4k came up with the goods. Many thanks for supplying it to us for The Tourist. And Mo’s comment was: “I liked the compact size of it and the sharp shadows using the clear lens. It was a very valuable tool in the right situation.”*”
